

The Abstract

4.1 There shall be an abstract bound into the Major Project/Dissertation immediately after the Acknowledgements and before the table of contents.

4.2 The abstract shall provide a concise synopsis of the Major Project/Dissertation stating the nature and scope of the work undertaken and the main conclusions which have been drawn from the findings.

4.3 Abstracts are an integral part of the work to be assessed and must be produced in strict accordance with the following requirements:

- a. the abstract shall not exceed 300 words, produced in single spacing on one side of A4 or letter size paper;
- b. the abstract shall conform to the following specification:
